

GENERAL CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE AWARD OF UCD ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS, 2010/2011

1. University College Dublin will award a number of Entrance Scholarships to students entering the University for the 2010/2011 academic year.
2. Entrance Scholarships are valued at €1270. These scholarships are tenable for one year, the first year of a primary degree course, only in University College Dublin.
3. Entrance Scholarships are awarded on the basis of points received in the Leaving Certificate. For the purpose of the Scholarship, points will be calculated on the basis of the student's best six subjects. In the case of Medicine, the combined HPAT and Leaving Certificate score will be used.
4. Only students who present for the Leaving Certificate for the first time are eligible for the award of Entrance Scholarships; in the case of Medicine, the HPAT and Leaving Certificate both must be presented for the first time.
5. Persons who already hold a degree are not eligible for the award of an Entrance Scholarship.
6. To qualify for the Scholarship, an eligible candidate must have registered for a place in the first year of an undergraduate degree programme in University College Dublin.
7. In the event that a student who has been granted a deferred first year place would have been eligible for a scholarship had s/he not deferred, the scholarship may be deferred, for one year only.
8. No age limit will apply.
9. Candidates are not required to make special application to be considered for the award of these scholarships. Eligible students will be contacted directly by the University as soon as possible after the issue of place offers.
10. The scholarship will be awarded based on the available information concerning applicants following first year registration.
11. Entrance Scholarships are not finalised or paid until after (i) first year registration and (ii) receipt of the Leaving Certificate results from the Department of Education and Science at the conclusion of the appeals process. (*Usually Mid-October*)
12. The decision of the Governing Authority, as to the eligibility of any candidate, the awarding, withholding, or any deduction to be made from, the Entrance Scholarship shall be final and conclusive.
13. The holder of an Entrance Scholarship, to be known as an 'Entrance Scholar', will, in addition, be given priority in the allocation of places in the UCD residences, where circumstances permit. **NB** Entrance Scholars must still apply as normal for accommodation through SIS web.
14. A student may hold only one major UCD scholarship. In the event of a student qualifying for more than one major scholarship, the scholarship of greater value will be awarded.
15. Candidates may only be awarded the UCD Entrance Scholarship once.
16. An Entrance Scholar who leaves the University before the end of the session may be required to repay the amount received in respect of that session.
17. The Leaving Certificate points level on or above which students will be automatically awarded a scholarship will be published annually. The levels for the awards in September 2010 are given in the table which follows.
