Residential accommodation

Residential accommodation at UCD is positioned discreetly throughout the main college campus (Belfield) and at nearby Blackrock, a friendly village on Dublin's southside.

UCD provides the perfect educational environment, helping to keep your students focused on their studies while also allowing them to experience authentic Dublin life.

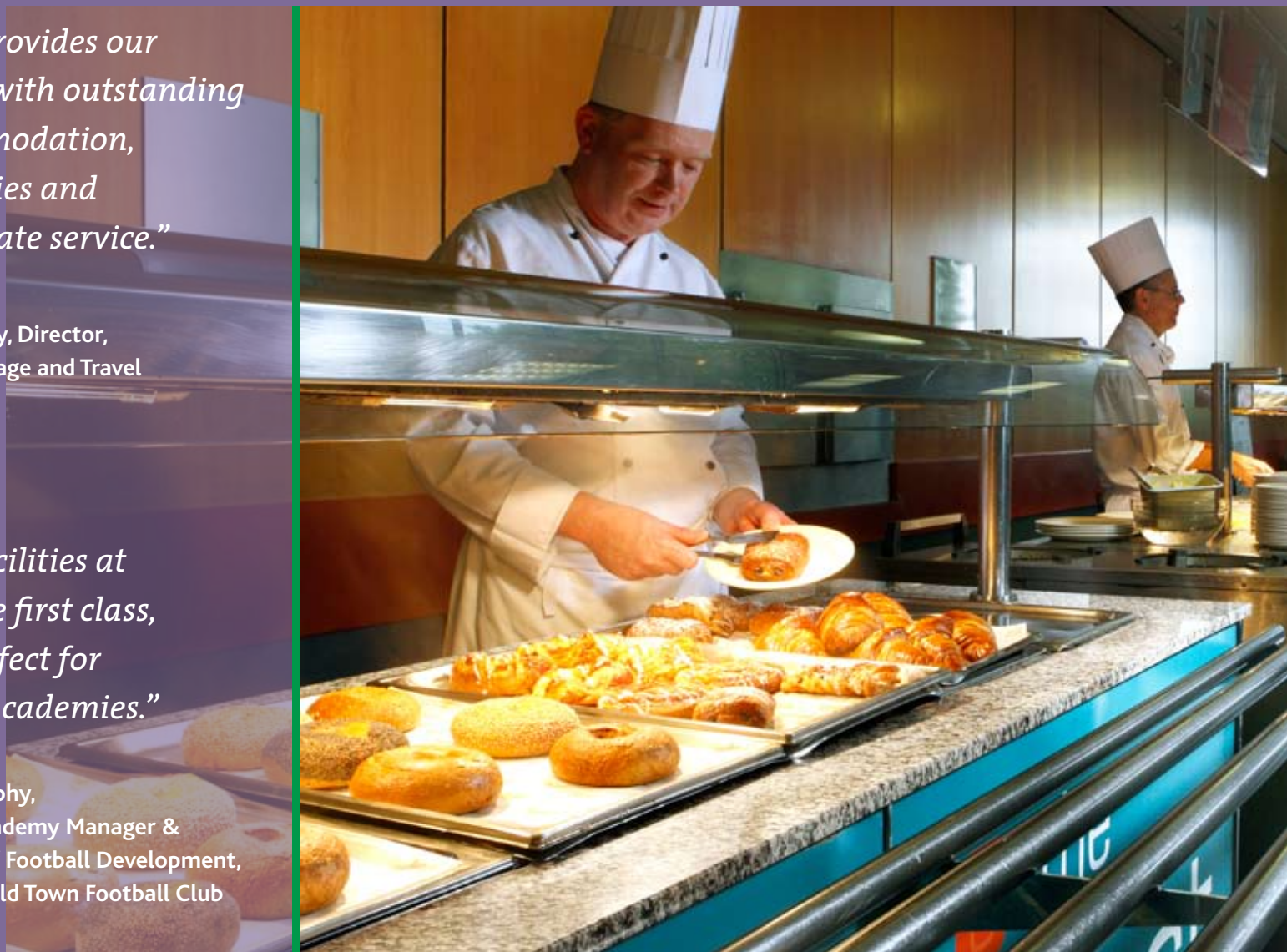

In the heart of Dublin

The main UCD campus at Belfield is just 4 km (2.5 miles) from the centre of Dublin, one of Europe's most youthful, dynamic and vibrant cities. The city is easily accessible and offers an unbeatable blend of historical, cultural, sporting and retail attractions.

Frequent buses on a dedicated Bus Corridor whisk you into the heart of Dublin in less than fifteen minutes.



We are also within easy reach of Dublin airport, and a direct Aircoach service passes our gates. Located on the southern fringes of Dublin, we are less than twenty minutes from both the mountains and the sea.

Within a 40 km (25 miles) radius, you will find superb

national treasures such as the 5,000 year-old passage tomb at Newgrange and the ancient Irish monastic settlement of Glendalough, with its beautifully preserved medieval "round tower."
