



Late/Retrospective Extenuating Circumstances

UCD has a policy for Extenuating Circumstances that allows consideration of **serious** and unforeseen circumstances that had a serious effect on your ability to engage with your modules. Grounds for consideration must be beyond your control, and you must provide suitable supporting evidence.

Timeframe:

Retrospective applications should be submitted within **1 trimester of the circumstances** BUT depending on the severity or exceptional nature of the circumstances, applications will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Retrospective applications will only be considered in exceptional situations by the Programme Examination Board Sub Committee.

All of the following supporting documents are required:

- 1. A letter to the BDIC Provost detailing why the application is retrospective in nature.
- 2. An email or letter of support from your Programme Director for the period affected and any academic planning or advice they can provide **OR** *your Student Adviser if you have previously been in contact with them* about your extenuating circumstances.
- 3. Supporting evidence must be uploaded before your application can be considered. Types of required evidence are detailed in the upload section of the google form.

Qualified professionals include:

- Medical practitioner
- Other Health Professional
- BDIC Student Support Professional (e.g. Student Counsellor)
