



UCD Pride Coffee Mornings

UCD EDI is inviting Colleges and Vice President Areas to collaborate with UCD Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Unit and UCD EDI LGBTI+ Subgroup to host a local Pride coffee morning for employees in their respective area in February.

UCD Pride Coffee mornings are held in February (LGBTI+ History Month) to promote a visible and supportive presence on our campus for both our LGBTI+ colleagues and to continue to demonstrate our values to our students. These activities run in parallel with LGBTI+ inclusive initiatives led by UCD Students' Union.

This is an excellent opportunity for UCD Colleges and Vice President Areas to visibly demonstrate commitment to inclusion of LGBTI+ colleagues and students, affirming LGBTI+ people and recognising the value of visibility and allyship in support of UCD's values of inclusion and collegiality.

Why Celebrate Pride and LGBTI+ Inclusion in UCD?

- Support a welcoming, inclusive work and learning environment where LGBTI people can be open about their sexual orientation and gender identity.
- Foster dialogue and facilitate greater understanding of the lived experience of LGBTI+ colleagues in your discipline/area.
- An opportunity for senior leaders and colleagues to visibly demonstrate commitment to inclusion for LGBTI+ staff and students and encourage greater allyship.
- Recognise and celebrate the contributions of LGBTI+ people in shaping the culture of this University.
- Deepen dialogue with LGBTI+ employees on how your College/Area can be more LGBTI inclusive.
- Stand in solidarity against anti-LGBTI+ hate crime and violence in Ireland. Hate crime statistics published by <u>An Garda Síochána in 2023</u> indicate that there has been a 12% increase in reported hate crimes & hate related (non-crime) incidents with 651 hate crimes & hate related (non-crime) incidents recorded in 2023 (582 in 2022). The most prevalent discriminatory motive was anti-race (36%), followed by anti-nationality (18%) and anti-sexual orientation (16%). These three motives have been the most common across in the past three years. Anti-nationality overtook anti-sexual orientation to become the second most prevalent motive in 2023.UCD condemns racist, anti-nationality, LGBTI+ violence and all hate-related incidents and crimes.

This major resource enables UCD students, educators, and researchers to throughly explore subjects such as LGBTQ history and activism, cultural studies, psychology, sociology, political science, policy studies, psychology, sociology, political science, policy studies, bnuman rights, and more Sourced from major gay and lesbian organizations worldwide, the archive includes over 2.5 million pages of rare and unique content from newsiteters, papers, government documents, pamphlets and other types of historical documents.

UCD EDI Ten Tips for LGBTI+ Inclusion

Raising awareness lets your colleagues and students know that you are inclusive of LGBTI+ people and against the discrimination of, and violence towards, LGBTI+ people. UCD EDI has provided Top Ten Tips to encourage UCD employees to visibly and proactively show their support for the inclusion of LGBTI staff and students in the University Community.

- 1. Promote **Supports** for LGBTI+ employees and students.
- 2. Be mindful of your own assumptions and choice of language: Glossary of terms.
- 3. Don't assume everyone is heterosexual or that their gender identity corresponds with their birth sex.
- 4. Address homophobic, biphobic, transphobic and intersexist behaviour. Learn more: UCD Dignity and Respect Training.
- 5. Know the law: The Employment Equality Acts (2015) outlaw discrimination on the ground of sexual orientation and gender.
- 6. Promote UCD's Gender Identity and Expression Policy.
- 7. Add your pronouns to your email signature. Example: Joe Bloggs [he/him]

 what's this? You may wish to add a short explainer after the pronoun with the following url: www.mypronouns.org/what-and-why/
- 8. Respect Confidentiality in terms of sexual orientation, gender identity, sex.
- 9. Participate in University LGBTI+ inclusion initiatives and training.
- 10. Demonstrate Leadership lead by example and contribute to an inclusive culture at UCD.
