Policy Toolkit: Policy vs Procedure – Explanatory Note

What is a Policy?	Any committee decision or management directive, which sets out the official position of the University on any aspect of the institution's activities. A policy mandates key principles and provisions to enable decision making and is usually accompanied by a procedure explaining how the policy is implemented. Institutional policies are formally approved by University Management Team, Academic Council or Governing Authority, and have broad application across the University.
What is a Procedure?	Detailed mandatory direction on how the policy (principles) will actually be implemented in an operating environment. Normally a procedure exists to support policy on an operational level. In some cases, a procedure exists where there is no policy. Procedures can be developed subsequent to policy. Most procedures are developed and approved by the policy owner, some are approved at University-level together with the policy.

Case 3	NO	YES	NO	No university policy exists in the policy area due to the issue being operational or for historic reasons.
