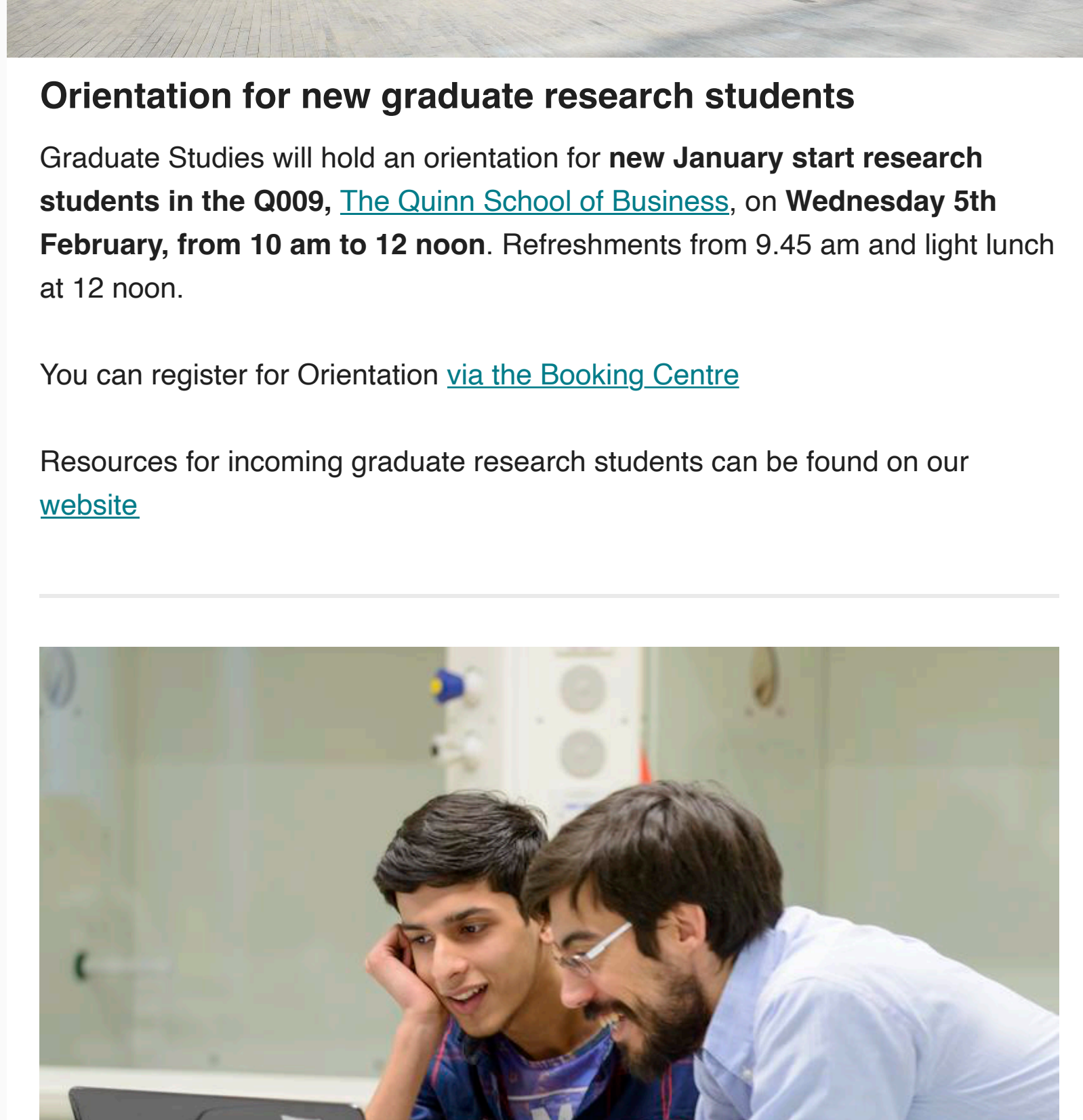

EUPATI Modules available to UCD PhD Students


UCD and the European Patients' Academy on Therapeutic Innovation



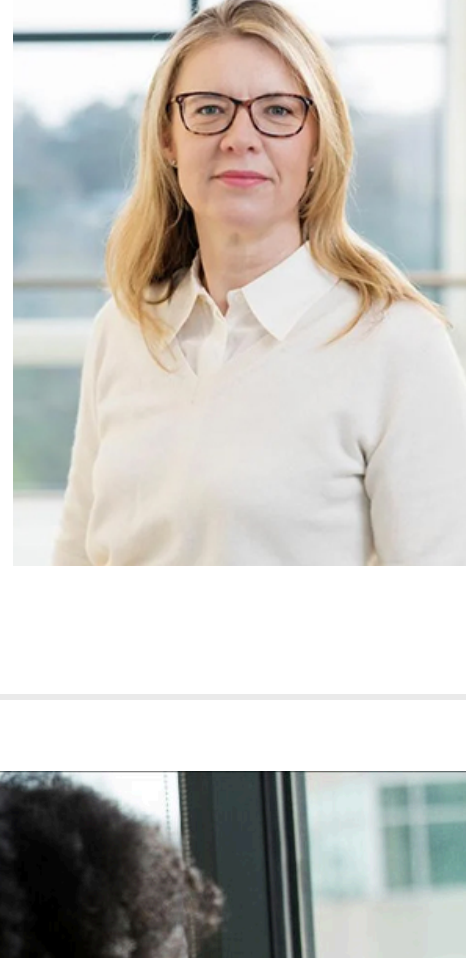

Career Action Plan (CAP) programme for Graduate Researchers via ZOOM

Starting on 23rd Jan and then every Thursday lunchtime for 6 weeks - a short 50 min session to support your CAP.

Designed as a 6-week career development programme, the Career Action Plan for Graduate Researchers includes six online careers workshops supported by linked resources on MyCareer and Brightspace.

The online 1-hour workshops take place at lunchtime every Thursday and are exploratory and discursive in nature, featuring individual reflection, group discussion, interactive activities, and Q&A.


The workshops are supported by follow-up resources on Brightspace including reflective exercises, active tasks, and related video and literature resources.
