Introduction

This programme is directed at well-qualified graduates in law, politics and associated disciplines. It builds on the strengths of the UCD Centre for Human Rights which has members from UCD Sutherland School of Law, UCD School of Politics and International Relations and UCD School of Social Policy, Social Work and Social Justice.

Faculty members have engaged in major research, spanning the full range of international human rights law from Asylum Law and Practice, the EU and Fundamental Rights, to the Law of Privacy in Ireland.

Applicant Profile

- This programme is intended for applicants with a Law degree, or an interdisciplinary degree in which law was a major component. An upper second class honours, or international equivalent is required.
- Applicants holding a Graduate Diploma in Law can be considered.
- Exemption may be given to those with significant, relevant, practical experience or those with a relevant graduate qualification.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 (no band less than 6.0 and 6.5 or above in reading and writing), or equivalent.
