This interdisciplinary programme promotes critical analysis of different aspects of international law and business, and is directed at well-qualified graduates in law, business and associated disciplines. The programme offers

students with undergraduate qualifications in Law or Business (also including economics or finance) the opportunity for advanced study in both disciplines.

On completion, students will have developed critical thinking abilities not only on the development of and relationship between the two disciplines, but also on the application of knowledge to the worlds of law and business.

Applicant Profile

- This programme is intended for applicants with a degree in Law or Business, or a discipline cognate to business such as Economics or Finance. An upper second class honours, or international equivalent is required.
- Exemption may be given to those with significant, relevant, practical experience or those with a relevant graduate qualification.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 (no band less than 6.0 and 6.5 in reading and writing), or equivalent.
