
UCD MGA invites you to reconnect with your fellow classmates, reminisce about your time at the School of Medicine, and renew old bonds. The day will feature CPD lectures

We are still seeking class representatives for our **1960 and 1985** graduating classes. If you're interested in getting involved, please contact mga@ucd.ie.




