News

PhD candidate May Loong Tan has published an article titled *What makes a city breastfeeding* friendly? A qualitative analysis of interviews with breastfeeding women from Europe and Asia in Plos One. The paper outlines women's perspectives of an ideal breastfeeding-friendly city. May Loong's research is supervised by Professor Fionnuala McAuliffe. Read more here.



PhD candidate Dr Sean Naughton, and his supervisor Professor Mary Clarke, have published *The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on first-episode psychosis presentations in two early intervention in psychosis services* in the *Irish Journal of Psychological Medicine*. A significant increase in first episode psychosis presentations were observed post-pandemic. Find out more here.

Guidelines have been developed for the use of *Metformin for the Prevention of Antipsychotic-Induced Weight Gain*. The guidelines have been published in *Schizophrenia Bulletin* and include clear recommendations about the use of Metformin for people living with psychosis. The development of these guidelines was conducted by the PROGRESS research group, led by Professor Brian O'Donoghue. Read more here.



Research conducted by Associate Professor Oleksii Rukhlenko, Anna Tuliakova and Professor Boris Kholodenko from Systems Biology Ireland, in collaboration with researchers from Yale School of Medicine, has been published in *Science Advances*. The results outlined in the paper titled *cSTAR analysis identifies endothelial cell cycle as a key regulator of flow-dependent artery remodeling* validates the use of cSTAR and identifies key determinants of normal and pathological artery remodeling. Professor Carel Le Roux co-authored a paper, *Glucagon-like peptide-1 analogues reduce* alcohol intake, which was published in *Diabetes, Obesity and Metabolism*. The use of GLP-1 RAs in patients with obesity was associated with a significant reduction in alcohol intake. Read more **here**.

Associate Professor Kathleen Gorman, Professor Ellen Crushell, Professor Andrew Green and Professor Sally Ann Lynch were part of a team of researchers who published a *Catalogue of inherited autosomal recessive disorders found amongst the Roma population of Europe* in the *European Journal of Medical Genetics*. This data may assist medics in making diagnoses and therefore improve patient care. Further details are available here.

Professor Fiona McNicholas and Dr Blánaid Gavin have published a study *Examining the mental health trajectories of children and adolescents: a cross-cohort analysis* in *Psychological Medicine*. Developmental patterns of youth mental health across different countries were examined in collaboration with colleagues from the University of Cambridge. Read more here.



Professor Gerry Wilson was named a finalist in UCD's Research Impact Case Study competition for his research into Behcet's Disease. Professor Wilson's research has identified an underlying genetic mutation in some patients affected by this disease. Diagnosis of this subtype of disease is possible with a genetic test which will allow more definitive and faster diagnosis. Find out more here.

The **European Partnership for Personalised Medicine** has launched its second joint transnational call. They are seeking proposals on *Pharmacogenomic strategies for personalised medicine approaches*. Pre-proposal submissions should be made via the Research Management Systems by **10am on 11 February**. Find out more here.



The deadline for support for applications to the **European Research Council Advanced Grant** is **12 February**. Grants of up to €2.5million for 5 years may be awarded to principal investigators with a track-record of significant research achievements. Read more here.

The deadline for support for applications to the **European Research Council Starting Grant** is **28 March**. Grants of up to €1.5million for 5 years may be awarded to researchers with 2-7 years' experience post completion of their PhD. Find out more here.
