Who are we?

Why and how we collect and process the information and for how long we keep it?

We collect your personal data for the purpose of the application to the Systems Innovation for Sustainable Farming Microcredential and the associated Learner Fee Subsidy on the bases of consent. We will collect the following types of personal data:

Module Application:

- Name
- Email Address and Phone number
- Address
- Date of Birth
- Gender
- Native Language and English Language exam outcomes if applicable.
- Country of Citizenship and Birth
- Academic and Employment History

IKC3 Micro-credential Fee Subsidy Application:

• Country of Residence and related evidence

- PPS number and related evidence of PPS number
- Nationality or Residence Permit Information and related evidence
- Personal Statement

For students who accept an IKC3 Micro-credential- We will keep your data for six years after the micro credential is complete.

The above data is required to make an application to the Micro-credential and to access eligibility for the IKC3 Learner Fee Subsidy, as outlined.

Who has access to the information and who we share it with?

Internal access: The personal data collected from you will be accessed by UCD School of Biosystems and Food Engineering. As a Micro-credential, the UCD Micro-credntial team can also access this information.

External access: The IKC3 Learner Fee Subsidy for **Systems Innovation for Sustainable Farming** is processed by University College Dublin from funding provided by the Higher Education Authority. In the case of an audit by the Higher Education Authority, they may need to verify applications and associated documentation to ensure appropriate allocation of funds. This only applies to students who accept an IKC3 Micro-credential fee subsidy.
