A Tribute to Professor Wall: A Legacy of Public Health Excellence

On the 13th January colleagues from across the University, governance and industry organisations attended a reception in the University club to mark the retirement of Professor Patrick Wall, and celebrate his truly remarkable career and immeasurable impact on public health, veterinary medicine, and food safety. Speeches were delivered by CHAS Principal Professor Cecily Kelleher, Associate Professor Mary Codd, Assistant Professor Fiona Lalor, and Head of School Associate Professor James Matthews.





Professor Wall's contributions span continents, disciplines, and generations of students and professionals who have had the privilege of learning from, and working with, him. He has been an inspiration. His engaging, humorous, and thought-provoking teaching style made complex topics accessible and enjoyable. Students recall his ability to blend academic rigour with real-world application, making every lecture a captivating experience. His contributions to the Master of Public Health and Master of Food Safety and Risk Assessment programmes at UCD have shaped the careers of countless public health professionals worldwide.

Professor Wall has worn many hats, as a veterinarian, food safety expert, public health physician, educator and mentor. As the first Chief Executive of the Food Safety Authority of Ireland, he played a pioneering role in shaping food safety regulations in Ireland. His leadership extended to the European Food Safety Authority, where he served as Chairperson, influencing food safety policy at an international level. His work with the WHO, European Union agencies, and national governments cemented his reputation as a global expert and thought leader in One Health, epidemiology, zoonoses and risk communication.

Pat's mentorship has been life-changing for many. Colleagues and students describe him as an inspiration, a guiding light, always willing to advise, support and challenge his students. His dedication extended beyond academia, whether training army cadets in contact tracing, working with animals or his horses, championing food safety in global forums, or trekking through the Malaysian rainforest to engage with indigenous communities. His passion for public health




Institute Research Showcase 2024

The UCD SPHPSS Institute for Sport & Health has again been ranked #1 in Ireland in the ShanghaiRanking's Global Ranking of Sport Science Schools and Departments. We are delighted to report that we are now #17 in the world, up from #24 in 2023 and #25 in 2022. These rankings reflect the School's commitment to continually improving and enhancing our world-class sports science education and facilities for our students and producing internationally recognised research in the sports science area.

UCD Research Impact Case Study Competition 2024

Professor Patricia Fitzpatrick and Dr Alison Connolly of the UCD School of Public Health, Physiotherapy and Sports Science were two of 11 finalists in the 2024 UCD Research Impact Case Study Competition, with Professor Fitzpatrick winning the Engaged Research prize for her work supporting cancer patients to quit smoking.

Professor Fitzpatrick's 'Supporting cancer patients to quit smoking post diagnosis' led to improved treatment outcomes and positive effects on patients' health. This Irish Cancer Society-funded research was co-developed with cancer patients who smoke to develop a way to help them cease smoking. Dr Connolly's 'Using human biomonitoring to understand chemical exposures among the population' studies include measuring human exposure to the most widely used herbicide in the world, Glyphosate. This research measured exposure levels and evaluated the risks among professional gardeners and agricultural workers. Read more here.

UCD SPHPSS Representation at the 2024 Winter Scientific Meeting of the Faculty of Public Health Medicine, RCPI





Dr Katy Horner gave an excellent presentation at an online Industry workshop, Plant-Based Proteins and Fibre – Optimising Nutrition for Healthy Ageing, an important deliverable for the APPETITE project that was held on November 5th 2024. The title of Katy's presentation was 'Is plant protein and fibre supplementation acceptable and feasible in older adults? Findings from the APPETITE multi-centre trial'.

Other contributors included our partners from Germany, France and the UK. Almost 70 people attended from across the Globe. The overall objective of APPETITE is to prevent undernutrition in community-dwelling older persons by enhancing appetite through targeted nutrition and physical activity.

PREVNUT Meeting, Dijon France 2024

From November 7th-8th, 2024, the UCD APPETITE team, including Professor Clare Corish, Dr Katy Horner, and PhD student Anna Quinn, attended a PREVNUT meeting in Dijon, France. Hosted at the Centre des Sciences du Goût et de l'Alimentation (CSGA-INRAE), the event brought researchers from institutions across Europe who had received funding under the JPI 'A Healthy Diet for a Healthy Life' call for the development of targeted nutrition for prevention of undernutrition for older adults (PREVNUT). The UCD team presented preliminary findings from the APPETITE project, contributing а programme featuring presentations on major initiatives AMBROSIA, CHOKO-AGE, EAT4AGE, and PROMED-COG. In addition to presentations, the meeting included poster sessions and workshops focused on preventing undernutrition and advancing research on ageing populations. Outside the sessions, attendees could explore the charming streets of Dijon and sample its famous Dijon mustard.


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Healthy UCD: Resistance Exercise Snacking Opportunity for Desk-Based Staff

Starting in early February 2025, this 8-week pilot will involve participants following an exercise programme and will include a pre- and post-assessment at the UCD Institute for Sport and Health.




Professor Patricia Fitzpatrick, co-authors Olalekan Popoola and Damzi Boms (MPH-EPH students graduated 2024) and colleagues from the National Screening Service and the National Immunisation Office, won the Best Research Project Paper in the Irish HealthCare Awards 2024.

The winning article "The effect of HPV vaccination on the rate of high-grade cytology in 25-year-old women attending cervical screening in Ireland" provides the first evidence of the benefit of the HPV vaccine in Ireland.

Launch of the ASPHER Core Curriculum for Public Health



The first edition of the Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region (ASPHER) Core Curriculum for Public Health (www.ccp.aspher.org), led by SPHSS Associate Professor Mary Codd and ASPHER Fellow, Karl Conyard (SPHPSS), was launched at the 17th European Public Health Conference in Lisbon in November. This has its origins in the work of the ASPHER over two decades on core competencies for public health professionals and represents a collaborative effort from 60 member Schools and Institutes of Public Health across Europe over the past 2.5 years. The extensive scoping and consultative processes resulted 35 subject areas collated into four domains of

- (a) Core Subject Areas, essential in all graduate programmes in public health;
- (b) Subject-specific Areas, largely determined by the challenges of our times;
- (c) Core cross-curricular Subject Areas, applicable across programmes and integrated with core and subject-specific areas; and
- (d) Core Interdisciplinary Professional Skills, emphasising the inter-disciplinarity of public health and the pivotal role of public health professionals in effecting change for the improvement and protection of the public health.

The overall objective of this Core Curriculum for Public Health is to reflect where and how education and training in public health can be improved to best equip current and future public health professionals to contribute maximally to their communities and societies, nationally and internationally.


New Assistant Professor

Common Assessment of Practice Placement Performance and Professionalism Competencies across Dietetic Programmes

In Ireland there are four higher education providers (HEI's) which, on successful completion, lead to eligibility for graduates to register with CORU as a Dietitian. TUD hosts the only undergraduate programme; UCD, UL and UCC host postgraduate programmes. Currently programme has unique placement assessment forms and portfolios of evidence. All programmes ensure that students demonstrate competence in practice placements but do so in subtly different

There are obvious issues with duplication of work for example, but also for sites taking students from multiple HEI's. The professional organisation in the UK, the BDA, is working towards common assessment across a significant number of HEI's and have done extensive scoping work and a SWOT analysis.

The Irish Nutrition & Dietetic Institute is highly supportive of common assessment. In an effort to work towards the development of common assessment in Ireland, all HEI's began collaborating. At a meeting in UL on Nov 14th, significant progress was made on defining and agreeing competence domains. A significant body of work remains to be done and UL successfully applied for and achieved funding from the HSCP office for 0.2 FTE Dietetic Tutor specified purpose contract to partially address this need. All HEI's look forward to moving on to the next stage of engaging with Practice Educators in January and thereafter students past and present.

Developing and Progressing Links with Sustainable Food Systems and Enhancing Student Competence in Food Service Provision to Healthcare

As part of the Module Practice Placement 1 in the MSc Clinical Nutrition & Dietetics programme, students are required to demonstrate CORU mandated competencies: a) an understanding of food legislation and food safety in the context of nutrition and dietetic practice, and b) knowledge of food preparation and the principles of food service processes including recipe development, documentation and standardisation, menu ordering, manual and electronic systems, procurement, preparation, meal assembly, distribution, and waste management. Each Autumn, the programme placement team recruits at least 12 large-scale, usually hospital-based, catering services capable of providing the learning opportunities that facilitate competence achievement.

This project was undertaken in the Catering department at SVUH, where students Leah and Alix updated the menu database resource to ensure an accurate reflection of ingredients and recipes and provided recommendations to the Catering and Dietetic departments based on the analysis.

Students pairs undertake a specific research or audit project identified by the Catering Manager in collaboration with the local Dietetic Service, whenever possible. The project outcomes provide substantial, valuable, highly relevant data. In 2024, the placement team hosted an event at UCD which was live streamed. The class presented their project findings to the programme team and Catering and Dietetic staff members involved in their placements.

All students are encouraged to submit their poster to the research symposium hosted by the Irish Nutrition & Dietetic Institute in March. The programme team aims to host this presentation event annually. Furthermore, in line with the programme team's attempts to promote sustainable food systems, incoming students undertaking Catering placement in 2025 will build on the outcomes and recommendations from the previous year's projects.

These opportunities equip our students to collaborate and communicate effectively with teams and to understand the need to monitor, evaluate, and audit the quality of practice, be able to critically evaluate their own practice against evidence-based standards, and implement improvements based on the findings of these audits and reviews. The programme team wishes to acknowledge and sincerely thank all the Catering and Dietetic sites and staff who have contributed to student training since the programme's inception in 2016.

School Athena Swan Process Update

The Athena SWAN Charter is a framework established to promote gender equality and inclusivity within higher education and research institutions. The School was awarded the Athena SWAN Bronze Award in 2021. We are currently preparing our new application for submission later this Spring.



As part of this process, the School is conducting an audit of activities and engaging with students and staff through surveys and interviews. This process is being led by Prof Akke Vellinga, Associate Dean for EDI, and supported by colleagues from across the School.
