Summary Entry Requirements (for 2025 entry)

How do I apply?

Generally, if you are eligible for EU fees, you should apply via the Central Applications Office (CAO) for admission to undergraduate courses in UCD. It is best to apply online at www.cao.ie.. The CAO handbook, which gives details of application procedures and closing dates, is available on the CAO website. www.cao.ie

If you are not eligible for EU fees (see below) or you are a transfer applicant (post-year 1), you must apply directly to the University. Please see www.ucd.ie/admissions for details.

When must my results be with CAO?

All documentation and exam results which you are presenting for assessment for entry to UCD must be with CAO no later than the dates below:

• Irish Leaving Certificate 2025	result issue date
• UK A-level 2025	result issue date
 Other exams (including previous Leaving Cert/A-level) 	1 August 2025
 Other applicants (e.g. QQI- FET/Mature/Transfers): 	See relevant UCD website overleaf.

UCD will not make offers after the third week of the trimester. Where results are received later than this due to circumstances beyond the applicant's control, a deferred offer may be issued.

How do I know my fee status?

- Were you born outside the EU/EEA?
- Have you, or your parents, lived outside the EU/EEA for 3 of the last 5 years?
- Are you a non-EU/EEA National?
- Have you previously attended a third-level institution (in Ireland or elsewhere)?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, you may not be eligible for "free" fees or EU Fees. You must visit www.ucd.ie/fees for information on the fees and to undertake a fee assessment.

If you are deemed to be a non-EU candidate for fees purposes, you should apply directly to UCD at www.ucd.ie/global.

General Regulations

Are there age limits?

Students must normally be 17 years of age by 15 January following entry: i.e. for entry in 2025, date of birth must be on or before 15 January 2009. There is no upper limit.

How are applications assessed?

Admission to all courses is competitive (i.e. there are more applicants than places) and, other than Access routes (e.g. mature years or QQI FET), is based on the Leaving Certificate points system or equivalent. In the case of Medicine, the HPAT-Ireland results are taken in combination with the school-leaving results.

Do any courses require health screening?

If you are admitted to any of the following courses, you will be required on admission to pass a health screening and vaccine process and from time to time thereafter, in accordance with the health policy of the College of Health and Agricultural Sciences.

- Biomedical, Health and Life Sciences (DN440)
- Human Nutrition (DN262)
- Medicine (DN400 and DN401)
- Physiotherapy (DN420)
- Radiography (DN410 and DN411)
- Nursing (DN450-453)

Is any other screening required?

You will be required to satisfactorily complete vetting in accordance with our Student Vetting Policy if you are admitted to some courses. Currently these are:

- Human Nutrition (DN262)
- Medicine (DN400 and DN401)
- Nursing (DN450-453)
- Physiotherapy (DN420)
- Radiography (DN410 and DN411)
- Education (DN760)

Depending on placement:

- Sport, Health & Exercise Science (DN425)
- Sports & Exercise Management (DN430)

If you have lived outside Ireland for more than 6 months since the age of 18, you must provide Police Certificates for those countries. If a relevant offence is disclosed by the relevant vetting body, you may not be permitted to register.

How will my EU exams be assessed?

UCD has agreed methods for converting all other recognised EU/EEA qualifications to a points equivalent. Please see our website for details. EU applicants presenting non-EU qualifications should contact Admissions for advice.

Irish Leaving Certificate

What are the minimum entry requirements (matriculation)?

To be eligible to compete, you must present at least six recognised subjects (including all those necessary for the course, see overleaf) and you must obtain a minimum of Grade H5 in two subjects and a minimum of Grade O6/H7 in the remaining four subjects.

For all courses Irish and English are required. (Candidates born outside Ireland or educated outside Ireland for significant periods and candidates with certain disabilities may be entitled to claim an NUI Irish exemption. See www.nui.ie for details)

What subjects are recognised?

All subjects of the Leaving Certificate – Higher and Ordinary level – are recognised, except as follows:

- 1 The subject 'Mathematics Ordinary Alternative/Foundation Level' will be accepted for matriculation registration purposes. However, points will not be awarded for this subject, and it cannot be used as a substitute for the subject 'Mathematics' in courses for which 'Mathematics' is an entry requirement.
- 2 The subjects 'Gaeilge Bonnleibhéal' (Irish-Foundation Level) will not be accepted for matriculation registration purposes or points.
- 3 The Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme (LCVP) is not an acceptable qualification for matriculation purposes but it may be included as a subject for points.

Are there any combinations of subjects not permitted?

- 1 The subject 'Physics and Chemistry' may not be presented with either 'Physics' or 'Chemistry'.
- 2 'Agricultural Economics' may not be presented with 'Economics'.
- 3 'Classical Studies' may not be presented with 'Latin' or 'Greek'.

Applicants presenting Leaving Certificate results which include subjects that are no longer offered should contact www.ucd.ie/askus with regard to acceptability and any exclusions which may apply.

What are the Laboratory Science Subjects?

The following subjects in the Irish Leaving Certificate are recognised laboratory science subjects: Agricultural Science; Biology; Chemistry; Physics and Chemistry (Joint); Physics. See minimum entry requirements link at www.ucd.ie/lc for further details. For some courses, additional subjects are recognised as laboratory science subjects (see website).

What languages meet the third language requirement?

All languages offered in the Irish Leaving Certificate other than Irish and English. It does <u>not</u> have to be a European language.

The points system:

As there are usually more applicants than places available, admission to undergraduate courses is competitive based on a points system.

The examination results of applicants who matriculate and meet Course Entry Requirements are assessed based on points allocated for grades obtained in the Leaving Certificate examination.

Notes:

- 25 additional points will be awarded for a grade H6 or better in Leaving Certificate Mathematics, where that subject is one of the six subjects being counted for points purposes.
- The school-leaving examination performance of applicants is scored on the basis of the applicants' best results in no more than six individual subjects taken in the Leaving Certificate examination of any one year. Where an applicant presents school-leaving examinations in two or more years, the best result in a single sitting will be selected for scoring purposes.
- The one-year scoring restriction does not affect the separate matriculation requirements of the National University of Ireland; i.e. it is still possible to complete matriculation requirements over more than one year, except for Medicine where applicants must meet the minimum entry requirements in the same sitting of the Leaving Certificate that they present for points calculation purposes.

The subjects and combination of subjects not permitted for matriculation also applies when computing an applicant's points score.

Does UCD accept the Applied Leaving Certificate?

No, this examination does not meet matriculation or entry requirements.

QQI-FET applicants

If you have a QQI-FET Level 5 or Level 6 Certificate with distinctions in five modules, you may be eligible to apply on that basis for many of our courses. Please note, entry is competitive and more than five distinctions may be required.

The list of awards acceptable for each course and modules required is available at www.ucd.ie/FET.

A-Level Applicants

To matriculate on the basis of A-level and GCSE examinations you must obtain Grade C or better in two subjects at A-level and passes in four other recognised subjects at A-level/GCSE.

At GCSE, grade 4/C or better is regarded as a pass.

You must also meet Course Entry Requirements.

Please note, not all subjects are recognised. You should check the NUI website www.nui.ie for details of A-level subjects which are acceptable and those which will not be considered in combination (i.e. are mutually exclusive).

Does it matter if I've attended third level before?

You **must** include details of all previous third level attendance when applying. For some courses restrictions apply. www.ucd.ie/transfer. Previous third level attendance may have fees implications www.ucd.ie/fees.

What is my responsibility?

The onus is on the applicant to check entry criteria for the courses for which they are applying. Please note criteria can change from year to year.

As an applicant, it is your responsibility to provide full and accurate information in the application and to notify the University and CAO of any changes or corrections made to the original application. UCD may request verification from the issuing authority of any or all details on documentation presented. If documents are found to have been falsified the awarding body will be notified.

In the light of additional information, which was not available at the time of selection, an offer may be amended or, in exceptional circumstances, withdrawn. We also reserve the right to correct errors where they have been made in the communication of decisions and offers.

- 1 The following subjects are recognised laboratory science subjects:
 - Agricultural Science
 - Biology
 - Chemistry
 - Physics and Chemistry (Joint)
 - Physics

In addition to the subjects above Geography or Applied Mathematics or Computer Science may be used to meet the Laboratory Science subject requirement for Science (DN200).

- 2 Applicants for 2025 must have at least <u>60 hours</u> practical experience relevant to animal handling between 1 February 2022 and 7 July 2025 (see www.ucd.ie/vet admission).
- 3 Applicants who have previously been unsuccessful in a similar course will not normally be eligible.
- 4 Graduate entry pathway exists. Please see www.ucd.ie/grad_entry for details

- 5 Undergraduate entry to medicine for school leavers is based on **both**:
 - meeting the minimum entry requirements for the course in the same sitting of the Irish Leaving Certificate Examination that they present for points calculation purposes. A minimum of 480 points (or equivalent in other EU examinations) is required for consideration.
 - completing the required HPAT-Ireland test. The score from HPAT Ireland can be used for admission to an undergraduate medicine course commencing in the same year ONLY. For example, results from HPAT – Ireland 2025 can be used for undergraduate medicine courses beginning in 2025 but NOT in 2026.
 - The points for DN400 are adjusted when combined with HPAT Ireland (see link from DN400 on www.ucd.ie/lc)
- 6 If you enter with less than H3 in Leaving Certificate French, you will not be able to take Law with French Law.
- 7 If you enter with less than H4 in Leaving Certificate French, you will not be able to take any French language combination.

You can apply for each CAO code only once. The entry requirements and points will be the same regardless of which option you choose.
