Exam Venues

There are five types of exam venues:

• RDS Simmonscourt (In-person):

Your exam is at the RDS Simmonscourt. The start time and duration are listed on your timetable. Your seat numbers will be added to your personal timetable approximately five days before exams begin.

• Blackrock Exam Centre (In-person):

Your exam is at Blackrock Exam Centre. The start time and duration are on your timetable. Your seat numbers will be added to your personal timetable approximately five days before exams begin.

• Online:

Your exam is online, with a time slot allocated. Specific details (start time, duration, etc.) will come from your Module Coordinator.

• Classroom (In-person or Online):

Your exam takes place in a classroom setting. Details like location, start time, and duration will be provided by your Module Coordinator. Seat numbers listed in SISWeb for classroom exams can be ignored.

• Newman Exam Centre F104 (In-person for disability/temporary support):
Students with disability or temporary support will take exams in the Newman Building or the Arts Annexe, Hannah Sheehy-Skeffington Building. The venue will be listed as "Newman Exams Office F104" on your timetable. Arrive early for specific room details. Students registered for disability / temporary support must attend the Newman Exam Centre, your supports or an allocated seat will not be available in any other exam venue.

Assessments Not Scheduled:

If any of your modules are not listed on the timetable and you haven't received information from your Module Coordinator, or if you spot a scheduling conflict, contact your School immediately for assistance.

Registration changes made after the timetable is published will not be reflected in personalised timetables. If you have dropped a module, you can ignore the exam listed for that module. IX students and late registrants should approach an exam helper at the venue, who will direct you to the appropriate area for the exam (in-person exams only).

Disability and Temporary Exam Support:

Details on <u>disability</u> and <u>temporary exam support</u> are available through Access & Lifelong Learning. The temporary exam support application process opens **Monday**, **7 April** and closes **Wednesday**, **30 April**. Emergency requests after this date require medical documentation. If you experience injury during the revision or exam period, consider applying for Extenuating Circumstances. Students accessing disability support who have not yet confirmed should immediately email <u>disability@ucd.ie</u>
