PHD

The UCD School of Education offers a structured PhD programme in which students receive advanced education and training while pursuing original research in a chosen area of an educational specialty. The structured nature of the programme equips students with the necessary skills and guidance to become independent researchers. The accompanying modules provide an opportunity for students develop to deeper insights into educational science develop and key research techniques in areas relevant to their chosen field ranging analysis educational from statistical to philosophy. The production of a written thesis, normally leading to peer-reviewed publications, remains the core objective of the doctoral degree.

COURSE STRUCTURE

- The programme has three strands:
 - 1. Advanced research skills training
 - 2. Theory and praxis in education
 - 3. Original doctoral research
- The programme is taken in two stages:
- Stage 1: Combined taught and research activity to the value of 120 credits.
- Stage 2: Combined taught and research activity to the value of 150 credits that includes substansive original doctoral research.
- Course work normally takes place over three periods: Halloween; Mid-term February, and early Summer.
- Original doctoral research is conducted under the guidance of an academic supervisor and an expert doctoral studies panel.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

*Applicants will normally have

- a) High honours in relevant bachelor's degree (or equivalent) and/or
- b) High honours in an appropriate master's degree (or equivalent) and/or
- c) Evidence of other academic standing and/or relevant professional experience that demonstrates suitability for doctoral studies.



- The award of PhD is conferred on successful completion of a doctoral research thesis, or similar appropriate format.
- Taught components of the programme draw on a range of assessment methods that are matched to the learning outcomes of each module.
