Position Summary:

The role of the Technical Officer is to provide technical, training support and administrative support as appropriate to the Herd Health, Animal Husbandry and Farm Animal Clinical studies Section in the UCD School of Veterinary Medicine. The position will be based equally between UCD Lyons farm, and/or UCD Belfield. The appointee will provide research and teaching support to the section. Research support will be in the areas of reproductive biology including hormone / metabolite analyses, nutrition and herd health including feed analyses, herd health data entry and analyses. Teaching support will be in the areas of animal handling with large animals, laboratory and animal based practical's (e.g. nutrition and reproduction), and computer based expertise (e.g. computer support for both online and conventional teaching formats). The successful candidate will be expected to take a lead role in technical support in these activities. Candidates will have training, qualifications and experience relevant to endocrinology (hormone and metabolite analyses). The candidate should be able to demonstrate good initiative, a strong work ethic, high quality technical skills and excellent oral and written communication skills. Applicants must have experience in handling large animals such as cattle, sheep, horses.

Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

Technical Skills:

- Champion continuous technical improvements, setting standards and engenders flexibility within the team
- Contribute to the maintenance and upkeep of equipment involved in both research and teaching
- Keep up to date with technical developments and adapt to new technologies

Health and Safety:

- Champion best Health and Safety practices
- Ensure that safe practice and the use of protective equipment and clothing are part of the normal day to day routine
- Report risks which may affect safety at work to the designated supervisor and make them aware of the actions needed to contain, reduce or manage risks

- Assist with annual/forward planning activities

Mandatory:

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- Honours Degree (for individuals who commenced in UCD post November 2006); NCEA Diploma or equivalent (for individuals who commenced in UCD pre November 2006)
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, both oral and written
- Ability to work independently and under direction as well as an ability to work closely with others as part of a team environment
- Excellent planning and organisation skills including a demonstrated ability to work accurately with attention to detail
- Knowledge of health and safety legislation as it pertains to laboratory work
- Experience of supporting research activities with large animals (cattle, sheep, horses)
- Flexible approach to work, and willingness to assist with change in an evolving organisation
- Demonstrable evidence of computer literacy (MS Word, Excel, Powerpoint), educational software and online tools, and an ability to learn unit specific software
- Experience and ability to handle and restrain large farm animals (eg cattle, sheep and horses) and technical competence around animal procedures (blood sampling, ultrasonography)
- Technical skills including feed analyses, immunoassays, biochemical analyses, grass budgeting
- Candidates must demonstrate an awareness of equality, diversity and inclusion agenda

Desirable:

- Minimum 3 years' experience of working in a laboratory or workshop environment
- Experience of working in an educational setting including experience of interacting with all levels of staff and students
- Experience in working with herd data in a research setting

- Experience with diagnostic methodologies, e.g., immunodiagnostics and genomics (real time PCR and global genomic methods, etc)
- Experience with software used in an academic environment (e.g., teaching platforms such as Brightspace, Moodle, Adobe Presenter and Adobe Premiere Elements)
