Position Summary:

The Small Animal Surgery Service of University College Dublin Veterinary Hospital (UCDVH) handles primarily animals referred for specialist surgical care. The intern in Small Animal Surgery is an integral member of the patient care team, assisting with consultations, diagnostic investigations, surgical and post-operative management under the direct supervision of residents and senior clinicians in the specialty. Due to the nature of our patient population, the intern only rarely has the opportunity to act as the primary surgeon in the operative management of patients in the UCDVH. However, the inter commonly participate as an assistant surgeon in a large number of complex orthopaedic and soft tissue procedures.

Specific duties:

- Attend small animal surgical hospital inpatients weekday mornings 7:30 am.
- Assist final year veterinary students and hospital nursing staff with inpatient patient care
- Assist in consultations with patients and clients
- Perform sedation or general anaesthesia (unusual) for diagnostic investigation of small animal surgical patients
- Perform and/or assist veterinary students with obtaining diagnostic samples, IV catheterisation, and other procedures as required under the supervision of residents or senior staff
- Provide supervision and assist final year veterinary students performing elective surgical sterilisation procedures
- Assist with patient care and the efficient operation of the small animal surgery service as directed by residents or chief of service
- Monitor student medical record keeping
- Assist during operative procedures as directed by chief of service
- Participate in teaching of undergraduate practical classes in basic surgical skills and anatomy
- Provide assistance to senior clinician in shelter medicine and elective surgical sterilisation at an off-site facility (Dublin Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals shelter) as required

General Tasks:

- Assist with clinical research undertaken by SAS staff and residents. Assist with undergraduate and clinical teaching in small animal surgery
- Participate in SAS resident rounds, SAS journal club, SAS discipline meetings, UCDVH Resident Seminars, and other in-house educational and training opportunities, schedule permitting
- Provision of one didactic lecture in the veterinary medicine or veterinary nursing undergraduate degree program under guidance and supervision of the relevant module coordinator
- Provide effective verbal communication with clients
- Provide effective verbal communication with reception staff, nursing staff, students, and other disciplines

in the UCDVH

- Provide written operative procedure reports and discharge advice for first opinion patients in SAS as required
- Provide written update communications to referring veterinary surgeons under direct supervision by senior staff as required
- Ensure all SAS consumable and patient care associated charges are correctly accounted for on the consumable's sheets

Veterinary Medicine Students on SAS Rotation:

- Provide general assistance and supervision to students including daily patient assessment and SOAPing; care, maintenance, and replacement of wound dressings, bandages, and catheters; ordering and administration of drugs; and maintenance of complete and accurate medical records
- Maintain all hospital protocols with special attention to hand hygiene, barrier nursing requirements, and isolation protocols in accordance with UCDVH Infection Control Manual and hospital best practice to minimize nosocomial and surgical site infection
- Provide individual or small group tuition to final year veterinary medicine students in history-taking, general physical examination, orthopaedic examination, neurologic examination, problem identification and differential diagnosis list generation, diagnostic and therapeutic planning under the guidance of senior staff
- Provide guidance and vigilance in maintenance of strict aseptic technique in anaesthesia induction, the operating theatres, and the intensive care unit

Night-time and weekend duties and ways of working:

- Weekend and night-time duties will be equally shared between the small animal interns (anaesthesia, surgery, internal medicine, oncology, emergency and critical care / ICU and rotating interns)
- The intern will be scheduled on the night shift in a 1-in-5 rota, including weekend cover
- The intern will be scheduled on the day shift for weekend cover in a 1-in-5 rota
- The intern on evening duty will manage all routine and intensive care cases of hospitalised patients, with access to back-up residents (small animal internal medicine, small animal surgery, anaesthesia, diagnostic imaging) and senior clinicians for advice and assistance if required. Interns will also be expected to organise and supervise students in the hospital during the evening and night shifts
- Transfer of oncology cases back to the daytime staff will occur between 7-8am (usually before 8am daily)
- Assisting the resident on duty with case transfers from the Pet Emergency Hospital (PEH)
- Holidays may not be taken during periods when the intern is rostered on night shifts

UCD Veterinary Hospital:

- Maintaining hospital records, and checking that all appropriate information has been recorded daily, including pricing of procedures on hospital computer system
- Keeping drugs and instruments under secure conditions as directed by Chief of Service; maintaining the treatments register and the Controlled Drugs Register
- Making concerted efforts to develop and maintain good relationships with referring veterinary surgeons and clients, and help promote a positive image of the School and UCD Veterinary Hospital
- Informing clients of appropriate charges for services provided at the time of admission, and being instrumental in collecting same in conjunction with administrative staff
- Full care of hospitalised small animal in-patients especially after-hours
- Discharge patients with appropriate advice and medication after-hours as required
- Consult with senior clinicians regarding treatment and care of patients
- Co-ordinate treatment lists with nurses, residents and clinicians
- Assist clinicians with procedures
- Keep a logbook of cases
- Present at least one journal club and resident's seminar in the year
- Aim to produce one case report for publication within the year

Maintain all hospital protocols with special attention to hand hygiene, barrier nursing requirements, and isolation protocols in accordance with UCDVH Infection Control Manual and hospital best practice to minimize nosocomial infections

- Sufficient experience to enable effective after hours care of hospitalised patients
