The School of Veterinary Medicine, University College Dublin invites applications for the position of Assistant Professor in Small Animal Surgery, to commence from September 2025.

We are seeking a highly motivated, proactive individual, board-certified or board-eligible in Small Animal Surgery (ECVS or ACVS), who is passionate about delivering clinical and teaching excellence, is an excellent "team player" and has a strong interest in undergraduate and postgraduate teaching. This is an exciting opportunity to join a young, progressive, and growing team of diplomates and residency-trained surgeons. UCDVH has a renowned research portfolio and strong research links with other universities in the US/Canada and Europe. Our very large clinical caseload provides opportunity for ongoing clinical research that is actively encouraged.

Our hospital is facilitated with digital radiography, 32 slice Siemens CT and a brand-new state of the art 1.5T MRI, fluoroscopy, Karl Storz laparoscopic and arthroscopic imaging systems, operating microscope, full instrumentation for soft tissue, orthopaedic, neurosurgery and interventional radiology, and a radioactive iodine suite. Our orthopaedic/neurosurgery and soft tissue services are extensively equipped to offer BioMedtrix total hip, linear/circular IMEX external skeletal fixation, Synthes internal fixation, Karl Storz UHD arthroscopy, and instrumentation for intraoperative fluoroscopy (eg, SUB) and minimally invasive procedures (thoracoscopy and laparoscopy).
